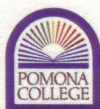

In 2004 Geoffrey Pullum shared the Linguistic Society of America's prestigious Leonard Bloomfield Book Award with co-author Rodney Huddleston for "The Cambridge Grammar of the English Language" (2002). His research has ranged across the linguistic and cognitive sciences, from the grammar of English to the philosophy of linguistics, and from practical phonetics to applications of logic in formalizing syntactic theories. He is also well-known as an entertaining speaker, as the author of satirical essays "The Great Eskimo Vocabulary Hoax" (1991), and as the co-author of the recent "Far from the Madding Gerund".
